PCOM Georgia's Opportunities Academy is a summer enrichment program primarily for motivated Gwinnett County high school students interested in exploring a wide variety of healthcare professions. Up to 50 students will have the opportunity to learn from PCOM Georgia's osteopathic medicine, pharmacy, physical therapy, physician assistant, and biomedical sciences students and faculty members, along with professionals in the field. Thanks to the PCOM Office of Diversity and Community Partnerships, the Opportunities Academy is a FREE learning event especially for students who identify as Latinx or African-American, and for those traditionally underrepresented in medicine. The target audience is current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders. In the past, participants who have been successful in the program exhibited a passion for science and math, a curiosity about health care, and a calling to care for others. High school students will have the opportunity to learn about healthcare topics, science-based research, team building and collaboration, high school productivity, college and professional school preparation, and virtual presence and etiquette. In addition, they will become familiar with career planning, proper business attire, resume writing and interviewing, financial planning and management, volunteering and so much more! The program will pair carefully selected PCOM Georgia mentors with the high school students who will learn about their mentors' path to a career in health care.
